FIRE SUPPRESSION PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Fire Suppression Program is located at Chemeketa Community College, Brooks Center which offers one of the most modern training facilities on the west coast. The eight-term Fire Suppression degree program offers a combination of classroom, lab and hands-on training. During the program students will learn to exhibit safety practices as a response team member when engaged in training or emergency response activities. Demonstrate effective verbal and written communications skills in both emergency and non-emergency situations. Explain effective risk reduction activities through accurate hazard identification and public education activities. Demonstrate the ability to collaborate with a diversity of colleagues to accomplish the goals of the organization and successfully participate in the daily operations of a fire station.

In addition to classroom and lab work, students get on-the-job training through 24-hour shifts as part of Chemeketa's on-campus fire department that serves as a back-up to other local fire agencies. During summer terms students have a unique opportunity to work at local fire agencies through a Cooperative Work Experience (CWE) program.

Upon successful completion of the program students will be awarded an Associates of Applied Science in Fire Suppression. In addition to the degree students will be licensed as an EMT Basic and receive DPSST Certification in NFPA HazMat Awareness and Operations, NFPA Fire Fighter I and II, NFPA Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator, NFPA Apparatus Equipped w/Fire Pump and entry level Wildland Fire Operations.

FIRE SUPPRESSION SELECTION PROCESS OVERVIEW

Fire Suppression is a limited enrollment program with a total of fifty-four positions are available. Incoming positions availability is based on total program positions less the number of continuing program students. For program eligibility see the "Who May Apply" section on the next page. Program Students will be selected upon completion of the XFRP5001A – Fire Suppression Selection Process course held each Summer Term. Selections are based on the FireTEAM written examination, oral board interview and CPAT testing which is pass or fail. Program students would begin Fire Program classes Fall term.

INFORMATION SESSIONS

The Information Session will discuss the Fire Suppression Program and expectations, FireTEAM test, local resident volunteer programs and provide an in-depth CPAT (physical fitness test) orientation.

WHO MAY APPLY

18 Years of Age	Applicant must be 18 years of age by the end of the first term. This will enable them to enroll in an EMT Basic course their first term in accordance with state rules.
High School Graduate or GED	High School diploma or GED required and verified through transcripts.
Academic Preparedness	Accepted as a student at Chemeketa Community College and have received a College "K" number.
Driving Record	A valid driver's license is required. Applicants must be able to furnish a certified copy of their driving record showing not more than two convictions for moving violations or two chargeable accidents or any combination of two thereof in past three prior years and no conviction of a moving violation which is alcohol or drug-related in the prior five years. All periods are calculated from the date of the first scheduled class in the beginning term.
Criminal Conviction	Persons with a criminal record of crimes against people, violent crimes, or multiple convictions may be disqualified. If you have such a conviction, contact the Program Chair or the Dean of Emergency Services and Diesel Technology.
Medical Examination	If selected for a position in the program, you will be required to submit proof of a medical examination pursuant to NFPA standards for firefighters. Copies of these standards are available from program staff.
Immunizations	If selected for a position in the program, you must submit proof of immunization for chickenpox, measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus and you must have at least the first in a series of immunizations for Hepatitis B. A negative tuberculosis (TB) test result is also required. Details for submitting records will be provided during Program Orientation. <i>Note: COVID-19 vaccinations rules are constantly changing within the healthcare and emergency services industries. Please check with staff about the current requirements for COVID-19 vaccinations.</i>

APPLYING FOR CHEMEKETA ADMISSION

In order to register for the Fire Suppression Selection Process course, you must first be a Chemeketa Community College Student. Read the below section that best describes your student status.

CURRENT “ACTIVE” CHEMEKETA STUDENTS:

If you do not have any holds on your account that prevent you from registering, please complete Step 1 on page 6 when your Registration Status allows you to register. Your Registration Status can be viewed in your MyChemeketa account, under Registration. If you have holds on your account and need assistance with registration please contact Enrollment Services (503.399.5001) or Academic Advising (503.399.5120).

FIRST-TIME CHEMEKETA STUDENTS:

First step:

- Apply for admission
 - **Select the “Starting Term” as Summer 2024.** This is important because the free non-credit course that takes you through the selection process is during the first five weeks of **Summer term**. If selected for the Fire Program you will start your program courses in the Fall term.

Next step: Expect the admission process to take **five to fifteen business days** before you receive notification that you have been accepted as a Chemeketa student. Once accepted you can continue the following steps.

- Claim your Chemeketa student account
- Apply for financial aid
- Complete the new student orientation
 - This is an online video that you access through your MyChemeketa account.
- Complete the placement assessment
 - Estimated processing time: 3-5 business days.
- New student advising
 - Book your appointment as soon as possible. Depending on the time of year students may have to book an appointment several weeks in advance.

FIRE SUPPRESSION SELECTION PROCESS COURSE

The Fire Suppression Program is a limited enrollment program. This means that there is a competitive selection process that takes place to select the students who will enter the program. The selection process is conducted during the first five weeks of summer term through the XFRP5001A – Fire Suppression Selection Process course. If selected for the Fire Suppression Program students will start program courses Fall term. Registration begins in May depending on your Registration Status that can be viewed in your MyChemeketa account, under Registration. **Follow instructions further on in this packet to be eligible to register for this course and for more information on what the course entails.**

STEP 1

Upon registration eligibility register for the XFRP5001A – Fire Suppression Selection Process course with the following instructions:

 - Note: There is a cost associated with obtaining driving records in Oregon.
 - If outside of Oregon, follow your states DMV policy for obtaining your driving record.

 - Acceptable records include: transcripts, diploma or certificate.

SUMMER TERM STARTS – JUNE 24, 2024

When summer term begins it is time to start the Fire Suppression Selection Process course. Candidates must complete each step to move onto the next step in the process. The following steps will walk you through accessing the course, uploading your documentation, signing up for your Oral Board Interview and CPAT test.

STEP 3

Access the Fire Suppression Selection Process course in Canvas:

Selection

Selections are based on the FireTEAM written examination, oral board interview and CPAT

Process:

STEP 5

Schedule your Oral Board Interview in Canvas with the instructions in Module 5.

- Interviews must be scheduled by **July 5, 2024**.
- During the interview candidates will be asked a series of questions by a panel made up of Emergency Services Staff and Fire Service Professionals.
- ***NOTE: If you arrive after your scheduled interview time, you will not be able to interview or continue with the selection process.***

Only those selected for CONSIDERATION in the upcoming class will complete Steps 6.

(Those selected will receive notification in Canvas messages on July 12, 2024.)

STEP 6

Schedule your CPAT Test in Canvas with the instructions in Module 6.

- CPAT Tests must be schedule by **July 18, 2024**.
- ***NOTE: If you arrive after your scheduled test time, you will not be able to test or continue with the selection process.***

Only those SELECTED in the upcoming class will complete Step 7.

(Those selected will receive notification in Canvas messages on July 24, 2024.)

STEP 7

Candidates that are selected for the Fire Suppression Program must attend the in-person **Mandatory Fire Suppression Program Orientation on July 26, 2024 from 8:00am to 3:00pm.**

Orientation will provide information and instruction for the following:

- Shift assignments
 - *Students in the Fire Suppression Program are on duty at Chemeketa for a 24-hour period every sixth day throughout their enrollment. The fire station operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, responding to emergencies with partnering fire agencies in Marion County, Polk County and Yamhill County.*
- Fall term schedule
- Chemeketa Student Rights & Responsibilities and Code of Conduct
- Program policies and procedures
- EMT requirements
- Immunization records
- Drug testing
- Criminal history report and fingerprinting
- Course registration
- Uniform specifications
- Personal protective equipment (PPE) specification
- NFPA 1582 - Standard on Comprehensive Occupational Medical Program for Fire Departments (Required Medical Evaluation)

FIREFIGHTER TESTING SYSTEM (FireTEAM) REGISTRATION

- Go to the National Testing Network (NTN) website at: nationaltestingnetwork.com
 - During this process you will be asked to make an account with the NTN, if you do not have one already. If you already have an account log into your preexisting account when prompted.
- **If you have taken this test in the past six months, please contact Allison Sebern.**
- Current price of the test is \$55.00. (This is subject to change, visit NTN's website for a current price list.)
- Click the "Find Jobs" tab at the top of the page
- For Job Class select Firefighter
- For State select Oregon
- Click the "Update" button
- Check Chemeketa Community College-Fire Protection
- Click the "Continue" button and "That is All I Want" button.
- Next verify that you qualify by selecting "I qualify. Continue." and click the "Continue" button.
- Select from the two types of testing options
 - Virtual Testing (see Page 12 for additional information)
 - Select "Virtual Testing" and click the "Continue" button.
 - Select a date and time that works best for you.
 - Click the "Continue" button.
 - Read all of the Virtual Testing Instructions carefully and then click the "Continue" button.
 - Continue to follow prompts to complete your test selection.
 - In-Person Testing
 - Select the physical testing center that you would like to test in-person at and then click the "Continue" button. (If prompted with a reminder click the "Continue" button.)
 - Select a date and time that works best for you.
 - Click the "Continue" button.
 - Continue to follow prompts to complete your test selection.
- You will be prompted to complete a self-assessment after you have signed up for your test. The self-assessment must be completed by the start of summer term.

When does the test need to be completed by?

- By the first day of Summer Term

Do I need to complete the Self-Assessment?

- Yes, the self-assessment must be completed by the beginning of Summer Term.

What does the FireTEAM test consist of?

Is the test pass/fail?

- No, the Fire Program will look at each candidate's individual scores.

FIREFIGHTER TESTING SYSTEM (FireTEAM)

There are four components to the FireTEAM Testing System: a human relations test, a mechanical aptitude test, a math test and a reading ability test. Total Test Time: Approximately 2 hours

Human Relations Test

Part I

The Human Relations Test focuses on teamwork and human relations skills and was specifically designed for firefighters. Candidates watch a video segment and then choose the best course of action in a multiple-choice format. The test items play without stopping.

Part II

Candidates are instructed to pay attention to the behaviors of the individual firefighters and supervisors portrayed in the Human Relations test, then answer questions about the characters. Part II immediately follows Part I.

Mechanical Test

The Mechanical Test is a multiple-choice mechanical aptitude test presented on video. Candidates see detailed introductions to an animated brick-making factory, then are asked questions about the factory. Most of the questions are about basic mechanical objects and principles such as valves and water pressure. They are also asked to answer troubleshooting type questions and observe system operations for problems. All of the questions can be answered based on common sense and observation of how everyday objects work.

Reading Test

This test is designed specifically for firefighters, a job requiring ongoing study of difficult and technical materials. Candidates are required to choose a word that best fits in the blank.

Math Test

This math test is designed specifically for firefighters. The questions are presented on video. Candidates must complete the calculations in their heads. No written calculation is permitted. Questions are based on the type of math that firefighters must use on a regular basis as part of the job. Basic areas covered include: addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and proportions.

Partial list of Instruction:

- You must download and use the NTN kiosk to take your exam! There are specific system requirements that are required in order to take the test that are listed on the link above.
- Any object other than what is needed to take the exam is NOT allowed. This includes but is not limited to:
 - Using the restroom during your exam is NOT allowed.
 - Multiple monitors are NOT allowed.
 - Wireless headphones or wireless earbuds are NOT allowed.
 - Cell phones or other electronic devices are NOT allowed in the room with you.
 - Sunglasses and hats are NOT allowed.
 - Food and drink are NOT allowed.
 - Vape pens and/or any type of smoking are NOT allowed.
 - Paper and pencil or pens are NOT allowed. (You will be provided an area to type notes needed during the exam).
- Taking The Exam
 - All virtual testing exam times are in Pacific time.
 - You must take the test in a private room with the door closed. No one else can be in the room or enter the room during the test.
 - Your computer can only have one monitor (screen).
 - You are required to log into the kiosk to take your virtual exam **at least 30 minutes before your scheduled test time.**
 - Before you begin testing, reboot your computer, then close all programs in your tray and disable screen savers. Any program that produces alerts must be shut down. Leave all programs closed until you are done testing.
 - The following will be monitored and recorded while the kiosk program is running:
 - Programs running on your computer
 - Your video
 - Your audio
 - Your actions in the exam and proctor windows
 - Your desktop
 - Test sessions can last up to three (3) hours. Take care of personal needs (i.e., food, restroom) before testing begins.
 - If your webcam cannot clearly show your ID details you will not be able to test.
 - You must wear clothing. Clothing tops and bottoms are required to join a virtual test session. A Casual Dress Code is acceptable as long as the clothing is not revealing and does not allow more of the wearer's body to be seen than is usual. No hats/head covering, thick glasses, wristwatches or unnecessarily bulky clothing.

PHYSICAL ABILITY TESTING - CPAT

The Candidate Physical Abilities Test (CPAT)

The CPAT was designed by fire fighters for fire fighters and endorsed by both the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) and the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF). The CPAT consists of eight events directly related to the job of fire fighter. Candidates complete each of the events in a predetermined path from one event to another. The events are placed in a sequence that simulates fire scene events.

The events consist of:

1. Stair climb
2. Hose drag
3. Equipment carry
4. Ladder raise and extension
5. Forcible entry
6. Search
7. Rescue
8. Ceiling breach and pull

During the events, candidates wear a 50-lb vest to simulate the weight of self-contained breathing apparatus and firefighter protective clothing. An additional 25 pounds is added to the candidate's shoulders during the stair climb event to simulate carrying a high-rise pack. The CPAT Orientation sessions give candidates an opportunity to preview each event. They have the opportunity to try out the weighted vests, the individual events and ask questions.

Throughout all events, candidates must wear long pants, a hard hat with chinstrap, work gloves and appropriate footwear with no open heel or toe. Watches and loose or restrictive jewelry are not permitted. Candidates will not be allowed to participate in the testing process without the appropriate attire. The Chemeketa staff will provide the hard hat and work gloves for use during the test.

The Firefighter CPAT is very strenuous. If you have had a recent illness, injury, surgery or are under medication, consult with your healthcare provider to determine if you should participate in the CPAT.
